Jelgava is the fourth largest city in Latvia by population and fifth – by territory.



On October 28th, 1938 the city's flag was approved. The flag is divided into two parts of equal breadth: the upper half is dark blue, the lower – red; in the centre of the flag is the Jelgava city coat of arms.




750th anniversary of Jelgava city


Budget revenues in 2015, EUR and %




Inhabitants in Jelgava





Resident population under working age, of working age, over working age, %




Migration balance in the major cities 2010-2015










Number of pupils in Jelgava primary and secondary schools








9th Grade graduates career choice in Jelgava, %




Jelgava Craft High school graduates and obtained qualification in 2014/2015


Number of pupils in Jelgava Technical School and Jelgava Craft High school 2003-2015




Number of employees working in Jelgava 2013-2015


Number of enterprises by form of entrepreneurship in Jelgava 2010-2014


Number of enterprises by type of activity in Jelgava 2014




Turnover of manufacturing and export in city Jelgava 2007-2015






Finances allotted to reconstruction of streets in Jelgava 2003-2015, EUR

Number of doctors in Jelgava 2009-2015











Pärnu (Estonia)

Cooperation agreement was signed in 1957. Collaboration occurs within the realms of education and culture. The city covers an area of 32 km₂. The population is approx. 43 500.

Siauliai (Lithuania)














Twinning cities
