
About Jelgava

Jelgava Large Coat of Arms

As approved by the National Heraldry Committee on the 24th of November, 2016, the Large Coat of Arms of Jelgava depicts two silver lions with heads looking backwards, red tongues and golden crowns, holding shield with Coat of Arms of Jelgava, standing on the silver base.

Coat of Arms

Jelgava is the only city in Latvia that contains the country's small coat of arms within its coat of arms. The city received the coat of arms at the same time as it received city rights, in 1573. The first coat of arms depicted a crowned stag head on a raspberry red field; the current coat of arms contains an elk head on a crimson field.

Flag

The City flag was approved on October 28, 1938. It is devided in two similar parts: dark blue on top and red on bottom. In the center of the flag Jelgava Coat of Arms is placed.




In 2012 Jelgava City logo was approved. The logo is made up of a contour of an elk head and the word "Jelgava". The large antlers symbolize the rich historical

experience and value of the city.



Structure for the implementation of revenues of the general budget of Jelgava city municipality, euro un %





Structure for the implementation of the general budget expenditure of Jelgava City municipality, euro un %



City population of long-term residents of Jelgava at the beginning of the year




Ethnic makeup at the beginning of 2019, %



Jelgava population, gender structure at the beginning of the year, %




Jelgava population gender/ age structure on Jan 1, 2018

Jelgava city population shown in under working age, in working age and retired proportion, at the beginning of the year,%






Number of children and lack of pre-primary schools places to child ratio in Jelgava city in 2010./2011. - 2018./2019.


Number of children in Jelgava primary and secondary schools in 2009/2010 – 2018/2019

Number of pupils in Primary and Secondary schools (1st to 12th grade)



Attendance of the seminars organized by Competence Development Center of the Zemgale Region, 2005 - 2018















Number of employees working in Jelgava, 2016-2018




Number of enterprises by form of entrepreneurship in Jelgava in 2010-2017




Number of enterprises by type of activity in Jelgava, 2017





The average monthly gross salary in public sector in Latvia and the largest cities 2014-2018, EUR (total, excluding private sector companies with less than 50 employees)



Turnover and exports of processing industry in Jelgava during the period from 2007-2018









Number of doctors in Jelgava 2011 - 2018











Number of served persons and number of beds in Jelgava hotels and other tourism establishments, 2009 - 2018




Number of tourists visiting Jelgava, 2012 - 2018






Rueil-Malmaison (France)


